

Education with Character

At The Totteridge Academy, we believe that school plays a crucial role in developing and shaping our students for the future. The opportunities we provide are essential for building character, and we are committed to ensuring that every child experiences these during their time in secondary school. Our Education with Character provision outlines our commitment to offering an excellent and diverse range of opportunities beyond the classroom. Each academic year, we will strive to fulfil every aspect of provision.

Each year all students will:

- be encouraged to take part in at least one extra-curricular club, within or outside of school.
- represent their house/tutor group/class in individual and team activities.
- share their views on the school through pupil voice surveys and focus groups.
- reflect on their aspirations and personal development goals with an adult in the school.
- hear from an inspirational speaker or coach.

In Key Stage 3, all students will:

- have the opportunity to represent the school in a sporting, cultural or academic event.
- have the opportunity to perform in a class production to an audience.
- watch a theatre production.
- volunteer time to serve the local community.
- have the opportunity to participate in a residential trip, allowing them to stay away from home and bond with classmates, provided their behaviour and attendance meet the academy's requirements.
- have the opportunity to demonstrate leadership.
- deliver a presentation to an audience.
- celebrate people, cultures and cuisine from a foreign country.
- visit a university.

At The Totteridge Academy, we strive to offer a wide range of clubs throughout the day, accessible to students in every year group. Our goal is to ensure these clubs reflect student interests and allow both teaching and non-teaching staff to share their expertise. Clubs start in October, and in the Spring term, students can suggest new clubs for the Summer term through an online survey, which we will accommodate where possible.
